

VILLAGE OF WYANET BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING SEPTEMBER 9, 2025

Village President Jim Blanford called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Following the pledge of allegiance roll call was answered by Blanford, Johnson, Law, Partain, E. Sproul, M. Sproul and Wood.
